Town will have advantage of setting up zoning restrictions that will be in place so that we will have a zoning plan where distribution locations can be. Also, we will establish zoning for consumption lounges "if" allowed. Currently, motions on table are that town will allow the sale and distribution, but we do not want lounges.

~ Discussion with Chief Berardi ~

Councilman Kitchen: Asks what Chief is seeing now that marijuana is legalized. What is he seeing? Concern is how the new legislation affects the police department.

Chief Berardi: Law pertains to possession of marijuana. Certified expert in department, Officer Miller. Department has adapted. No statistics in New York State at this point to determine if there has been a problem.

Councilman Van Kleeck: Unsure if a lounge will be harmful to a community. Testing vs practice. No statistics or strong feeling. If we table this to next month, will we know more about zoning.

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Kovacs: We will not have feedback from County, but can have a proposed code regulating both lounges and retail. Same zoning districts for lounges that were discussed for retail dispensary.

Councilman Van Kleeck: Would feel more comfortable waiting until next month.
